

Snake River Juvenile Detention Center PREA Report for 2019

The Snake River Juvenile Detention Center places emphasis on the importance of training for all staff, including detention officers, medical and mental health staff, volunteers, and juveniles in the area of the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA). Every year, all parents, who come in to visit their children in custody, are also given a pamphlet on PREA and sign an understanding of our policy.

The Snake River Juvenile Detention Center has a “Zero Tolerance” policy and approach in all aspects of daily functions. Any and all accusations are thoroughly investigated. The investigation agency continued to be the Twin Falls City Police Department for 2019. Management and staff will always cooperate with any investigation. Any accusation under PREA is taken seriously.

Information gathered during investigations is used to enhance the safety, security, policies, procedures and training within the facility.

The Snake River Juvenile Detention Center completed and passed its second PREA Audit on August 28, 2019. The auditor was Steven G. Jett.

There was one unsubstantiated PREA incident for the year 2019. “An unsubstantiated allegation means an allegation that was investigated and the investigation produced insufficient evidence to make a final determination as to whether or not the event occurred.” (<https://www.prearesourcecenter.org/ec-item/1373/1155-general-definitions>)
