Summary of Discussion

Todd Ballard gave an overview of the Snake River District's education and outreach efforts within the community.

Alex Joslin reported on similar education and outreach activities conducted by the Twin Falls District.

J.D. Messner summarized projects completed in the prior year utilizing Water Quality Association (WQA) funds.

Rick Rogers reported on the condition of the Roseworth Reservoir canal and the need for improvements and updates.

The Balanced Rock, Snake River, and Twin Falls Districts each requested \$8,500 in county funding for FY2027. The request reflects wages for two staff members per district. The districts noted that the State provides a 2:1 match based on the County's contribution. Figures presented were based on the prior year's allocation.

Commissioner Reinke requested that three copies of the formal budget request letters be submitted to the Commissioners' Office for review.

Commissioners considered the Consent Agenda; items may include status sheets, employee requisitions, alcohol licenses, tax cancellations, Sheriff's Office Security Agreements, and Commissioner minutes.

Commissioner Hawkins made a MOTION to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Commissioner Matthews SECONDED. Discussion Commissioner Hawkins reviewed the items in

the Consent Agenda to include a status sheet for Adult Probation and an employee requisition for Adult Probation. Motion passed unanimously.

In the Matter of BOARDS

Commissioners considered the appointment of Lea Stone to the Pest Abatement District Board.

Commissioner Matthews reviewed the request to appoint Lea Stone to the Pest Abatement District Board. Heidi Tubbs, Pest Abatement District Board Chairman reviewed the process followed by the Board prior to recommending Ms. Stone's appointment.

Commissioner Matthews made a MOTION to approve the appointment of Lea Stone to the Pest Abatement District Board. Commissioner Hawkins SECONDED. Discussion Commissioner Hawkins noted that there is a bill moving through the legislature currently that would affect the PAD Board and encouraged the public to be aware of changes in the law. Commissioner Matthews expressed his appreciation for the board members that volunteer to serve. Motion passed unanimously.

In the Matter of BIDS

Commissioners considered Bids for the Wright Ave Jail Detention Furniture Project.

Bob Beer, Facilities Director, reviewed the bids received for the Wright Ave Jail Detention Furniture Project and noted that he believed that the bidders did not understand the bid requirements, as several bids were received late and others did not include the necessary information. Mr. Beer recommended rejecting all bids and rebidding the project.

Commissioner Hawkins made a MOTION to reject the bids on the Wright Ave Jail Detention Furniture Project and restart the process with clear instructions on the bid requirements. Commissioner Matthews SECONDED. Discussion Commissioner Reinke noted that there was time to start the process over. Motion passed unanimously.

In the Matter of COUNTY PROPERTY

Commissioners considered a request from Ray Perron to access Centennial Park boat ramp for commercial purposes.

Commissioner Reinke noted that the meeting was not a public hearing and reviewed the time frames allowed for presentation, questions and deliberation as well as who would be allowed to speak during the meeting.

Mr. Ray Perron spoke and introduced the people that were there supporting his request. Mr. Perron read a prepared statement to the Board. Commissioner Matthews asked for clarification on the plan. Mr. Perron noted the process would entail 10 uses over a 2-year period.

Bob Beer, Facilities Director, spoke and noted the park is a public park. Mr. Perron referenced an approved agreement, which it was not approved by the Commissioners. The bond that was submitted references an agreement that was not approved by the Commissioners making the bond invalid. Mr. Beer noted that he just received and had minimal time to review the documents

submitted by Mr. Perron to the Commissioners. Mr. Beer reviewed his concerns for potential damage to the boat ramp. The ramp would be shut down if it is damaged which could take several months to repair it. Mr. Beer expressed his concern for the potential damage to the docs and the boat ramp.

Mr. Ray Perron spoke and noted that Mr. Beer is not an expert and disputed everything stated by Mr. Beer. Mr. Perron asked Mr. Stace Campbell to speak regarding his experience and his findings on the ramp. Mr. Campbell noted that the information provided to the Board is fact and not opinion.

Commissioner Matthews stated that his questions had mostly been addressed. Commissioner Matthews noted that Mr. Campbell stated that there would be an operation plan presented which had not been provided previously by Mr. Perron. Commissioner Matthews expressed concern with the bond including that it terms out in a year which was the original discussion with Mr. Perron and that Mr. Perron had initially requested one use and now has changed that to 10 uses. Commissioner Matthews stated that the new information presents additional questions for him. Mr. Perron stated he thought there was possibly a miscommunication with Mr. Beer. The use would be as low as possible. Mr. Perron also noted that there would be a control plan presented as part of an agreement.

Commissioner Hawkins noted that she was new to the process and was not an engineer. Commissioner Hawkins stated she understands supporting small business but she also believes that the property is public property and she has received multiple requests from the public to deny the use. Commissioner Hawkins stated that she is struggling with allowing one entity the access which could interrupt public use of the property.

Commissioner Matthews noted that the 10 uses increase the potential for damage and the time to repair potential damage creates another issue. Commissioner Matthews asked Mr. Perron if the use could happen during off season to allow time for repairs should something be damaged. Commissioner Matthews noted he would also prefer higher water. Mr. Perron stated that he has a report that shows the clearance and water levels and provided that information to the Board.

Commissioner Reinke expressed concern that Mr. Perron had threatened to close the trail to Pillar Falls if the County does not allow the use of the facility. Mr. Perron stated that his concern was that without the ability to do the improvements, his business would close and he would not be able to maintain the trail nor provide insurance to protect his liability.

Commissioner Matthews reviewed a portion of an e-mail that was received by the Board regarding Mr. Perron's threat to close the trail if permission is not granted.

The Board discussed options for a decision. Commissioner Matthews noted that he does not want to put off the decision and appreciates the public that attended the meeting. Commissioner Matthews stated there is still information that he needs prior to making a decision and he has concern that there are other items that affect employees of the county, and ISDA so he is unable to make a decision at this time. Commissioner Hawkins stated that she appreciates all the information presented and the investment of the applicant. Commissioner Hawkins stated that she

has heard from her constituents and they have asked her to deny the request as it is public property, not commercial. The property has been developed for the public to use and she does not have the authority to shut it down to the public for one individual to use it for commercial use. Commissioner Reinke noted that between the County and USDA, over \$900,000.00 has been spent on the property. The County does allow commercial use as AWOL uses the park. With the current information and the changes in the plan that was originally discussed; it has created a lot of questions. Commissioner Reinke stated that a specific plan needs to be made and the plan that has been presented at this point is not sufficient. Commissioner Reinke also has concern with the perceived threat to close the Pillar Falls trail if Mr. Perron's request is not approved.

Commissioner Matthews stated he would like to see a plan that works for the Sheriff's Office, USDA and the County that he can consider. Commissioner Hawkins stated that since she was not involved in the beginning and doesn't have enough information, the cleanest process would be to deny the request and then start the process over with clear information. If that was done, then Commissioner Hawkins would have a clear answer when the public comes to her with concerns. Commissioner Reinke expressed concerns about the deficiencies that the divers reported and stated that the end of the ramp needs repaired soon.

Commissioner Hawkins made a MOTION to deny the request as presented today and request that the applicant meets with the Board and presents a new request with solid information and a plan for the project. Commissioner Matthews SECONDED. Discussion Commissioner Matthews noted that he was concerned with the implications of a denial but would support a reset. Motion passed unanimously.
