In the Matter of CONTRACTS

Commissioners considered a Cornerstone Inc. proposal for Airteq hardware.

Bob Beer, Facilities Director, reviewed the Cornerstone Inc. proposal for Airteq hardware with the Board. Mr. Beer noted that this bid had been previously received for the Wright Avenue Jail project in the amount of \$241,667.00 and the proposal appears to be in order.
