Proclamation

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-026

WHEREAS, the Twin Falls County Juvenile Detention has files that are in need of destruction; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 31-871 governs the retention and destruction of county records and classifies records as permanent, semi-permanent, and temporary, and further directs the county commissioners to classify records not specifically listed in that code; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 31-871(2) requires that permanent records be retained for not less than 10 years; semi-permanent records be retained for not less than five years after the date of issuance or completion of the matter contained within the record; and temporary records shall be retained for not less than two years; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 31-871(2) states that records may be destroyed by Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners after regular audit and upon the advice of the Prosecuting Attorney;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Twin Falls County Board of Commissioners that the Juvenile Detention records, as outlined in Exhibit A attached to this resolution, are classified as semi-permanent and may be destroyed based on the record's age and classification. All records as outlined in Exhibit A have been maintained for at least 5 years after the date of completion and all records involve juveniles who have now turned the age of eighteen (18).

Consideration of annual property tax exemption short forms.

The scoresheet took information provided in the applications and provided a score with an offer percent range and an offer term range. The Russet St. project location score was 61% with an offer range of 51%-75% for a term range of 3-5 years. The Hansen project location score was 69% with an offer range of 51%-75% for a term range of 3-5 years.

The Board discussed the offer ranges based upon the scoresheet. Commissioner Hawkins noted that Lamb Weston is a valued partner and a large economic driver for the community. Commissioner Hawkins noted that she would like to have the same contract terms for both projects with 4-year term starting at 75% tapering down 10% each year thereafter. Commissioner Matthews noted he would be comfortable with that term. Commissioner Reinke noted that he felt it was a

fair exemption. Commissioner Hawkins expressed her appreciation for the contribution to the community from Lamb Weston.
