Party Affiliation or Changing Party Affiliation Primary Election May 21, 2024

Deadline to Change Party Affiliation

Party affiliation determines which ballot a voter is eligible to vote. **March 15, 2024** is the last day for an elector currently registered with a party to change their party affiliation or become unaffiliated. This can be done by filing the Idaho Political Party Affiliation Declaration Form with the County Clerk for the Primary Election.

Unaffiliated Voters (voters currently registered with no party preference)

An "unaffiliated" voter may select a political party affiliation up to and including Election Day.

- Before Election Day, the unaffiliated elector may file a signed form with the county clerk.
- On Election Day, an unaffiliated elector may affiliate with a party when signing the poll book.
- The absentee ballot request form can also be used for an unaffiliated voter to select a party.

The Constitution, Libertarian and Republican parties have closed their primary election to electors who have affiliated with their party. The Democratic party has opened their primary allowing any affiliated or unaffiliated elector to receive a democratic ballot.

If you are affiliated as:

- Constitution, you can request a Constitution, Democratic or non-partisan ballot.
- Democratic, you can request a Democratic or non-partisan ballot.
- Libertarian, you can request a Libertarian, Democratic or non-partisan ballot.
- Republican, you can request a Republican, Democratic or non-partisan ballot.

**** The non-partisan ballot will not contain any party candidates****

If you are unaffiliated and do not wish to affiliate with a party, you can request a Democratic or non-partisan ballot. If you are unaffiliated and wish to receive a Constitution, Libertarian or Republican ballot, you must change your affiliation to that party.
